## Pope John Paul II: Christ's Resurrection Was a Concrete Event

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

1. In the liturgical season running from Easter to Pentecost, the Church is recollected in contemplation of the risen Christ. Thus she relives the primordial experience that lies at the basis of her existence. She feels imbued with the same wonder as Mary Magdalen and the other women who went to Christ's tomb on Easter morning and found it empty. That tomb became the womb of life.

Whoever had condemned Jesus, deceived himself that he had buried His cause under an ice-cold tombstone. The disciples themselves gave in to the feeling of irreparable failure. We understand their surprise, then, and even their distrust in the news of the empty tomb. But the Risen One did not delay in making himself seen and they yielded to reality. They saw and believed! Two thousand years later, we still sense the unspeakable emotion that overcame them when they heard the Master's greeting: "Peace be with you."".

2. The Church is based on their extraordinary experience. The first proclamation of the Gospel was nothing other than the testimony of this event: "This Jesus God raised up, and of that we all are witnesses!" (Acts 2:32). The Christian faith is so linked with this truth that Paul did not hesitate to declare: "If Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain" (1 Cor 15:14). Along these lines the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches: "The Resurrection of Jesus is the crowning truth of our faith in Christ, a faith believed and lived as the central truth by the first Christian community, handed on as fundamental by Tradition; established by the documents of the New Testament; and preached as an essential part of the Paschal mystery along with the cross" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, n. 638).

Christ's Resurrection is the strength, the secret of Christianity. It is not a question of mythology or of mere symbolism, but of a concrete event. It is confirmed by sure and convincing proofs. The acceptance of this truth, although the fruit of the Holy Spirit's grace, rests at the same time on a solid historical base. On the threshold of the third millennium, the new effort of evangelization can begin only from a renewed experience of this Mystery, accepted in faith and witnessed to in life.

3. Regina caeli, laetare! Rejoice, Holy Virgin, because He whom you bore in your womb is risen! Dear brothers and sisters, let us try to relive the joy of the Resurrection with Mary's heart. Even in the darkness of Good Friday she prepared herself to receive the light of Easter morning.

Let us ask her to obtain for us a deep faith in this extraordinary event, which is salvation and hope for the world.

### ON THE ROAD TO EMMAUS By Ronald Rolheiser

Nearly 2,000 years ago, two disillusioned youths consoled each other as they walked that seven-mile stretch of road separating Jerusalem from Emmaus. They moved slowly, depression having taken the spring from their steps. A double feeling clung to their hearts that day. They were hurting and there was reason. Their messiah and their dreams had just been crucified. A deep dark disappointment dampened their spirits. And there was fear. Most of all, there was fear. Not fear that they themselves might be crucified. That prospect loomed more welcome than the thought of going on. Theirs was that more horrible fear, the fear that comes from the realization that perhaps nothing makes a difference after all, maybe our dreams and our hopes point to nothing more real than Santa and the Easter Bunny. Maybe hope is only for children and the naive? They had been so excited, so full of hope. The uncrucified Christ had filled them with a dream. With that dream had come a new innocence, a freshness, an energy, a feeling absent since they had been children and which, prior to meeting Jesus, they had, long ago, unconsciously despaired of ever feeling again.

One weekend, one black Friday, had changed it all. They walked now, realistic again, more than 48 hours older, their dreams, like their messiah, dead, entombed. They had grown up a lot in one weekend. Their naiveté had died as it hung exposed, mocked and ridiculed by the wise. There was a lesson hard learned, but it brought a hurt and a disappointment beyond words. But another feeling clung to them too, like a demon refusing to be exorcised. The dream still burned holes in their hearts. Mocked and dead – maybe it didn't matter? Maybe something was more real than even death! Hurt beyond words, confused beyond doubts, they searched for words, grasped for trust. Then a stranger caught their step and caught their mood. They didn't recognize him. How could they? In their loss of trust, their messiah had died.

But the stranger begins to find the words: "Do they not yet understand the ways of God? Isn't it always when they don't understand, and have to trust, that they understand the most deeply? Wasn't it necessary for naiveté to be so exposed and ridiculed? Is that not its glory?" His words burned in them, touching and soothing that same deep part of the heart where the dream had lain. But they were only words, a balm, a momentary salve, nothing more. The doubt, the hurt, the fear, these lingered on. Emmaus and twilight appeared at the same time. The stranger had been a consolation. Why not ask him to stay? They continued to share, bread and consolation. Suddenly their eyes were opened. Their minds and hearts were opened even further. They understood. Jesus was with them again. The dream exploded anew like an atom split. They split, immediately, for the ends of the earth, hanging their naiveté and their dreams on crosses everywhere. The dream never died again. Easter Sunday had eclipsed a godless Friday. Christianity goes through multiple moods and feelings. Each age must struggle with its own emotions. Today, in terms of feeling, we live in that time between Good Friday and Easter Sunday. We are trudging along the road to Emmaus. Like the two disciples, we live with crucified dreams. Aesthetically, romantically, ethically, and religiously, we are surrounded by despair and its child, cynicism.

Dreams are giving way before the caveat of the cynic; faith is daily being displaced by doubt; and perseverance and long-suffering are all but extinct in a culture and church of release and enjoyment. Worst of all, there is fear, an unconscious fear whose tentacles are beginning to color every facet of life. It is the fear that perhaps our Christian hopes and dreams point to nothing beyond our own hopes and dreams. Perhaps faith is, after all, only a naiveté. Isn't Christ as dead as he was on Good Friday? Who, save perhaps for a few good thieves, is still turning to a cross for salvation? Yet there is something else: The dream still clings to us, refusing to let us go. It burns holes in us still, hanging on to us, even when in infidelity and despair we can no longer hang on to it. Hope is still more real than death. In our hurt, we are struggling for words and grasping for trust. We need to remain on the road to Emmaus. The stranger still stalks that same road. In his company we need to discuss our doubts, discuss the scriptures and continually offer each other bread and consolation. At some moment too, our eyes will be opened. We will understand and we will recognize the risen Lord. Then the dream will explode anew like a flower bursting in bloom after a long winter. We will be full of a new innocence. Easter Sunday will happen again.

## Guidelines For Public Liturgies During Pandemic - Capacity 50%

Should I come to Liturgy?

Anyone who is ill, symptomatic, or has been exposed to someone else with the coronavirus within 14 days cannot enter the church.

### What should I do if I cannot come to Liturgy?

We will continue to livestream our Liturgies on our Facebook page.

## How will we be kept safe when we come to Liturgy?

All pews are wiped down with disinfectant; and all Qurbono Books are removed; and all surfaces used frequently (restroom facilities, door handles, etc.) are sanitized before each service.

Everyone attending Liturgy is obligated to wear a mask or other facial covering. The only exception during Liturgy is when receiving Holy Communion. You'll be asked to observe social distancing – staying at least six feet from people not in your household. You can drop your donation in a stationary basket, or continue to use the online provided by your parish.

### Can we receive Holy Communion?

Yes, but only the Most Precious Body and only by hand.

Parishioners who would like to have Holy Communion brought to their homes should contact the office @ 978.685.7233 during normal business hours.

## What do we need to keep in mind as we leave Liturgy?

Please leave Liturgy together as a household, wearing your masks or other facial covering and observing six feet of distance from others.

Now on that same day two of them were going to a village called Gospel: Saint Luke 24: 13-35 Emmaus, about seven miles from Jerusalem, and talking with each other about all these things that had happened. While they were talking and discussing, Jesus himself came near and went with them, but their eyes were kept from recognizing him. And he said to them, 'What are you discussing with each other while you walk along?' They stood still, looking sad. Then one of them, whose name was Cleopas, answered him, 'Are you the only stranger in Jerusalem who does not know the things that have taken place there in these days?' He asked them, 'What things?' They replied, 'The things about Jesus of Nazareth, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people, and how our chief priests and leaders handed him over to be condemned to death and crucified him. But we had hoped that he was the one to redeem Israel. Yes, and besides all this, it is now the third day since these things took place. Moreover, some women of our group astounded us. They were at the tomb early this morning, and when they did not find his body there, they came back and told us that they had indeed seen a vision of angels who said that he was alive. Some of those who were with us went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said; but they did not see him.' Then he said to them, 'Oh, how foolish you are, and how slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have declared! Was it not necessary that the Messiah should suffer these things and then enter into his glory?' Then beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them the things about himself in all the scriptures. As they came near the village to which they were going, he walked ahead as if he were going on. But they urged him strongly, saying, 'Stay with us, because it is almost evening and the day is now nearly over.' So he went in to stay with them. When he was at the table with them, he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. Then their eyes were opened, and they recognized him; and he vanished from their sight. They said to each other, 'Were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us on the road, while he was opening the scriptures to us?' That same hour they got up and returned to Jerusalem; and they found the eleven and their companions gathered together. They were saying, 'The Lord has risen indeed, and he has appeared to Simon!' Then they told what had happened on the road, and how he had been made known to them in the breaking of the bread.

إنجيل القديس لوقا 35-24:13 ي البَوْم عَبِنه، كانَ ٱثْنَانِ مِنَ التَلامِيذِ ذَاهِيَبْنِ إِلَى قَرْبَة تُدْعَى عمَّاوُس، تَبْعُدُ نَحْوَ سَبْعَةِ أَمْيَالٍ عَنْ أُورَ شَلِيم. وَكَانَا يَتَحَادَثَانِ بِكُلِّ تِلْكَ الأُمُورِ الَّتِي حَدَثَتْ. وفيمَا هُمَا يَتَحَادَثَانِ وَيَتَسَاءَلان، إِذَا يَسُوعُ نَفْسُهُ قَدِ ٱقْتَرَبَ مِنْهُمَا، وَرَاحَ يَسِيرُ مَعَهُمَا. ولكِنَّ أَعْيُنَهُمَا أُمْسِكَتْ عَنْ مَعْر فَتِهِ. أَمَّا هُوَ فَقَالَ لَهُمَا: ﴾مَا هذَا الكَلامُ الَّذي تَتَحَادَثَانِ بِهِ، وَأَنْتُمَا تَسِيرَان؟ .«فَوَقَفَا عَابِسَين. وَأَجَابَ أَحَدُهُمَا، وٱسْمُهُ كِلْيُوبَاس، فَقَالَ لَهُ: »هَلْ أَنْتَ وَحْدَكَ غَرِيبٌ عَنْ أُورَ شَلِيم، فَلا تَعْلَمَ مَا حَدَثَ فِيهَا هذهِ الأَيَّام؟ . «فَقَالَ لَهُمَا: »ومَا هِيَ؟ . «فَقَالا لَهُ: »مَا يَتَعَلَّقُ بِيَسُوعَ النَّاصِرِيّ، الَّذي كَانَ رَجُلاً نَبِيًّا قَويًّا بِالقَوْلِ وَالْفِعْل، قُدَّامَ اللهِ وَالشَّعْبِ كُلِّهِ. وكَيْفَ أَسْلَمَهُ أَحْبَارُنا وَرُوَسَاؤُنَا لِيُحْكَمَ عَلَيْهِ بِالْمَوْت، وَكَيْفَ صَلَيُوه! وكُنَّا نَحْنُ نَرْجُو أَنْ يَكُونَ هُوَ الَّذي سَيَفْدِي إِسْرَ ائِيل. وَلكِنْ مَعَ هذَا كُلِّهِ، فَهذَا هُوَ اليَوْمُ الثَّالِثُ بَعْدَ تِلْكَ الأَحْدَاثِ. لكِنَّ بَعْضَ النِّسَاءِ مِنْ جَمَاعَتِنَا أَدْهَشْنَنَا، لأَنَّهُنَّ ذَهَبْنَ إِلَى القَبْرِ عِنْدَ الفَجْر، وَلَمْ يَجِدْنَ جَسَدَ يَسُوعٍ، فَرَجَعْنَ وَقُلْنَ إِنَّهُنَّ شَاهَدْنَ مَلائِكَةً تَرَاءَوْا لَهُنَّ وَقَالُوا إِنَّهُ حَيّ! ومَضَى قَوْمٌ مِنَ الَّذِينَ مَعَنَا إلى القَبْر، فَوَجَدُوهُ هكذَا كَمَا قَالَتِ النِّسَاء، وَأَمَّا يَسُوعُ فَلَمْ يَرَوْه . ﴿فقَالَ لَهُمَا يَسُوع: ﴿يَا عَدِيمَى الْفَهْم، وَبَطِيئَى القَلْبِ في الإِيْمَانِ بِكُلِّ مَا تَكَلَّمَ بِهِ الأَنْبِيَاء! أَمَا كَانَ يَجِبُ عَلَى الْمَسِيحِ أَنْ يُعَانِيَ تِلْكَ الآلام، ثُمَّ يَدْخُلَ في مَجْدِهِ؟. « وَ فَسَّرَ لَهُمَا مَا يَتَعَلَّقُ بِهِ في كُلِّ الكُتُبِ المُقَدَّسَة، مُبْتَدِنًا بِمُوسَى وَجَمِيعَ الأنبياء. وٱقْتَرَبَا مِنَ القَرْيَةِ الَّتي كَانَا ذَاهِبَيْنِ إِلَيْهَا، فتَظَاهَرَ يَسُوعُ بِأَنَّهُ ذَاهِبٌ إِلَى مَكَانِ أَبْعَد. فَتَمَسَّكَا بِهِ قَائِلَين: > أُمْكُثْ مَعَنَا، فَقَدْ حَانَ المَسَاء، وَمَالَ النَّهَارِ . « فَدَخَلَ لِيَمْكُثَ مَعَهُمَا. و فِيمَا كَانَ مُتَّكِنًا مَعَهُمَا، أَخَذَ الخُبْزَ، و بَارَكَ، وَكَسَرَ، و نَاوَلَهُمَا. فأَنْفَتَحَتْ أَعْيُنُهُمَا، وَعَرَفَاهُ، فَإِذَا هُوَ قَدْ تَوَارَى عَنْهُمَا. فَقَالَ أَحَدُهُمَا لِلآخَر: »أَمَا كَانَ قَلْبُنَا مُصْطَرِمًا فِينَا، حِينَ كَانَ يُكَلِّمُنَا في الطَّريق، وَيَشْرَحُ لَنَا الكُثُب؟ . ﴿ وَقَامَا فِي تِلْكَ السَّاعَةِ عَيْنِهَا، وَرَجَعَا إِلَى أُورَسْلِيم، فَوَجَدَا ٱلأَحَدَ عَشَرَ وَالَّذِينَ مَعَهُم مُجْتَمِعِين، وَ هُم يَقُولُون: »حَقًّا إِنَّ الرَّبَّ قَام، و تَرَاءَى لِسِمْعَان! . «أَمَّا هُمَا فَكانَا يُخْبِر ان بِمَا حَدَثَ في الطَّريق، وَ كَيْفَ عَرَفَا بَسُوعَ عِنْدَ كَسْرِ الْخُيْزِ.



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
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
