## Christian Engagement in Political Life: A Call to Discipleship

Dear Parishioners,

As Christians, our responsibility in political life goes beyond the act of voting, it is a daily commitment to our main Christian morales and values. Pope Francis, in his 2020 encyclical *Fratelli Tutti*, reminds us of our active role in fostering good and renewing our societies: “Let us take an active part in renewing and supporting our troubled societies... For our part, let us foster what is good and place ourselves at its service” (FT 77). This profound call challenges us to transcend partisan divides and live as disciples of Christ, shaping a world grounded in dignity, fraternity, and the common good. Acting like Christian disciples means being willing to build bridges rather than walls, to seek peace rather than conflict, and to find common ground rather than deepening divisions. History provides a powerful example in the witness of the early Church. Though Christians of the time had no influence over Roman rulers or policies, they transformed their society through humble service. They cared for the poor, nursed the sick, and upheld the dignity of every person in an empire that often ignored these values. Their witness, rooted in the Gospel, gradually shaped hearts and influenced the culture. Today, as inheritors of this legacy, we too are called to transform lives—not through power plays or divisions, but through humility, patience, and love. Pope Francis emphasizes the importance of co-responsibility in creating change. He urges us to move beyond expecting solutions solely from our leaders: “We should not expect everything from those who govern us, for that would be childish” (FT 77). Instead, we are invited to be active participants in building a more just and compassionate society. This involves seeking peace instead of conflict, building bridges rather than walls, and striving for unity amid polarization. As we welcome new leadership in both the United States and Lebanon, we find ourselves at a pivotal moment filled with both anticipation and uncertainty. Leadership transitions, whether in our own country or abroad, can evoke a mix of emotions—hope, doubt, and even anxiety. Yet, as Christians, we are invited to look beyond the transient nature of politics and place our ultimate trust in the Lord, the source of our hope. In the words of Pope Francis in *Fratelli Tutti*: “Each day offers us a new opportunity, a new possibility. Let us take an active part in renewing and supporting our troubled societies” (FT 77). This moment invites us to renew our commitment to building a world rooted in justice, peace, and dignity.

As citizens of the United States, Lebanon, and the Kingdom of God, we are called to be agents of transformation. Let us pray for our new leaders, that they may govern with wisdom, integrity, and a heart for the common good. May their decisions promote unity over division, peace over conflict, and hope over despair.

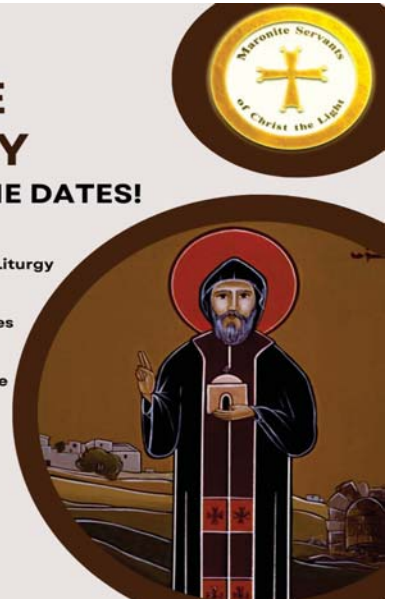

## Third Sunday after Epiphany: Revelation of Christ's Mystery to Nicodemus & the Jewish People

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*Book of Numbers 21: 4-9*

From Mount Hor they set out by the way to the Red Sea, to go around the land of Edom; but the people became impatient on the way. The people spoke against God and against Moses, 'Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no food and no water, and we detest this miserable food.' Then the LORD sent poisonous serpents among the people, and they bit the people, so that many Israelites died. The people came to Moses and said, 'We have sinned by speaking against the LORD and against you; pray to the LORD to take away the serpents from us.' So Moses prayed for the people. And the LORD said to Moses, 'Make a poisonous serpent, and set it on a pole; and everyone who is bitten shall look at it and live.' So Moses made a serpent of bronze, and put it upon a pole; and whenever a serpent bit someone, that person would look at the serpent of bronze and live.

*Letter to the Galatians 3: 23-29*

Before faith came, we were imprisoned and guarded under the law until faith would be revealed. Therefore the law was our disciplinarian until Christ came, so that we might be justified by faith. But now that faith has come, we are no longer subject to a disciplinarian, for in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith. As many of you as were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus. And if you belong to Christ, then you are Abraham's offspring, heirs according to the promise.

*Holy Gospel of Jesus Christ according to Saint John 3:1 - 16*

Now there was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a leader of the Jews. He came to Jesus by night and said to him, 'Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God.' Jesus answered him, 'Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above.' Nicodemus said to him, 'How can anyone be born after having grown old? Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?' Jesus answered, 'Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. Do not be astonished that I said to you, "You must be born from above." The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit.' Nicodemus said to him, 'How can these things be?' Jesus answered him, 'Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things? Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen; yet you do not receive our testimony. If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.'

كان إنسان من الفريسيين اسمه نيقوديموس، رئيس لليهود. هذا جاء ليلاً إلى يسوع وقال له: «رابي، نحن نعلم أنك جئت من الله معلماً، لأنه لا أحد يقدر أن يصنع الآيات التي أنت تصنعها ما لم يكن الله معه». أجاب يسوع وقال له: «الحق الحق أقول لك: لا أحد يقدر أن يرى ملكوت الله ما لم يولد من جديد». فقال له نيقوديموس: «كيف يقدر إنسان أن يولد وهو كبير في السن؟ هل يقدر أن يدخل ثانية حساً أمه، ويولد؟». أجاب يسوع: «الحق الحق أقول لك، لا أحد يقدر أن يدخل ملكوت الله ما لم يولد من الماء والروح. مولود الجسد جسد، ومولود الروح روح. لا تعجب إن قلت لك: عليكم أن تولدوا من جديد. الريح تهب حيث تشاء، وأنت تسمع صوتها، لكنك لا تعلم من أين تأتي ولا إلى أين تمضي: هكذا كل مولود من الروح». أجاب نيقوديموس وقال له: «كيف يمكن أن يصير هذا؟». أجاب يسوع وقال له: «أنت معلم إسرائيل وتجهل هذا؟ الحق الحق أقول لك: نحن نطق بما نعلم، ونشهد بما رأينا، وأنتم لا تقبلون شهادتنا. كل منكم في شؤون الأرض ولا تؤمنون، فكيف تؤمنون إذا كلتمكم في شؤون السماء؟ ما من أحد صعد إلى السماء، إلا الذي نزل من السماء، أي ابن الإنسان. وكما رفع موسى الحية في البرية، كذلك يجب أن يرفع ابن الإنسان، لكي تكون لكل مؤمن به حياة أبدية. هكذا أحب الله العالم، حتى إنه جاد بابنه الوحيد، لكي لا يهلك أي مؤمن به، بل تكون له حياة أبدية.

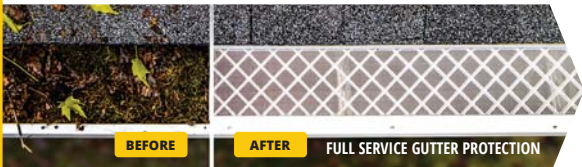
